Both citizens, and our state senators and representatives (collectively called the General Assembly) can refer issues to the ballot if enough agree to do so. This year, the General Assembly sent two issues to the ballot in the form of constitutional amendments for voters to decide on.

ELECTION 2022 FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

Q: WHAT IS THIS VOTER GUIDE?

A: This nonpartisan Voter Guide is designed to help you discover where the candidates on your ballot stand on key issues. Center for Christian Virtue (CCV), formerly known as Citizens for Community Values, sent surveys to every candidate in this Guide and provided the candidates equal opportunity to respond.

Q: WHO IS CENTER FOR CHRISTIAN VIRTUE?

A: Center for Christian Virtue seeks the good of our neighbors by advocating for public policy that reflects the truth of the Gospel.

Q: WHEN IS THE GENERAL ELECTION?

A: The General Election is Tuesday, November 8, 2022.

Q: WHEN DO THE POLLS OPEN AND CLOSE?

A: The polls open at 6:30 a.m. and close at 7:30 p.m.

Q: WHAT IS THE DEADLINE TO REGISTER TO VOTE?

A: You must register or update your voter registration no later than October 11, 2022, for the November 8, 2022, General Election.

Q: CAN MY CHURCH DISTRIBUTE THIS VOTER GUIDE?

A: Yes. Churches that have a 501(c)(3) tax status are allowed to distribute nonpartisan election information, like this Voter Guide.

Q: CAN MY CHURCH SPEAK IN FAVOR OR OPPOSITION TO A BALLOT INITIATIVE?

A: Yes. Churches that have a 501(c)(3) tax status are allowed to support or oppose ballot initiatives.

Q: CAN MY CHURCH ENDORSE OR OPPOSE A CANDIDATE FOR OFFICE?

A: No. Churches that have a 501(c)(3) tax status are prohibited from endorsing or opposing candidates.
